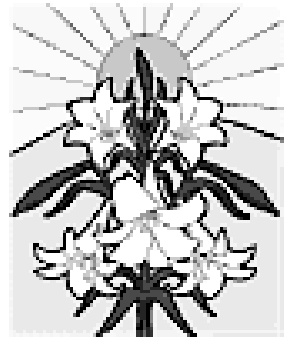

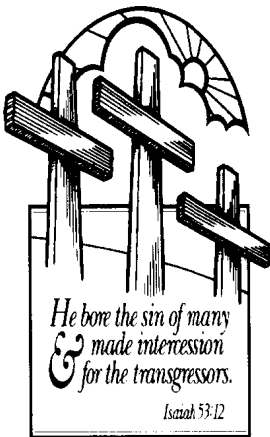

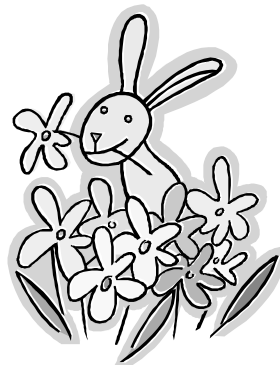

Our gifts support the work of The Presbyterian Committee for the [Self-Development of People](#), the [Presbyterian Disaster Assistance](#) Program, and the [Presbyterian Hunger Program](#). ### ***REPORT FROM BILL WINANS OF HOUSE & GROUNDS***

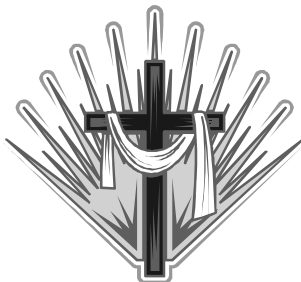
